**Multi-level and Intersectional Stigma and other Social determinant Effects on TB case Detection, care, and treatment outcomes: The MISSED TB Outcomes Study**

**Engaging traditional healers to identify undiagnosed HIV-positive patients in rural South Africa**

The purpose of this mixed-methods, pilot intervention is to development and evaluate a Healer-Clinician HIV Prevention Collaborative to facilitate testing and preventive service linkage among those who have traditionally avoided/refused HIV testing. The collaborative will include (1) Healer-Initiated Counseling and Testing (HICT) to reinforce the value of HIV testing and stigma reduction and coping strategies; (2) Establishing a path for patients to navigate between the traditional and allopathic systems to encourage repeat HIV testing (or treatment, if HIV-positive); and (3) Creating a welcoming environment at the health facility via improved clinician communication and “open house” sessions.

**Characterizing non-medical prescription opioid use and pain in people living with HIV**

The joint epidemics of HIV and prescription opioid use have greatly impacted the southeastern US. Non-medical use of opioids among people living with HIV is severely understudied and chronic pain, which is highly prevalent among people with HIV, is likely to be an important predictor of non-medical opioid use.
