



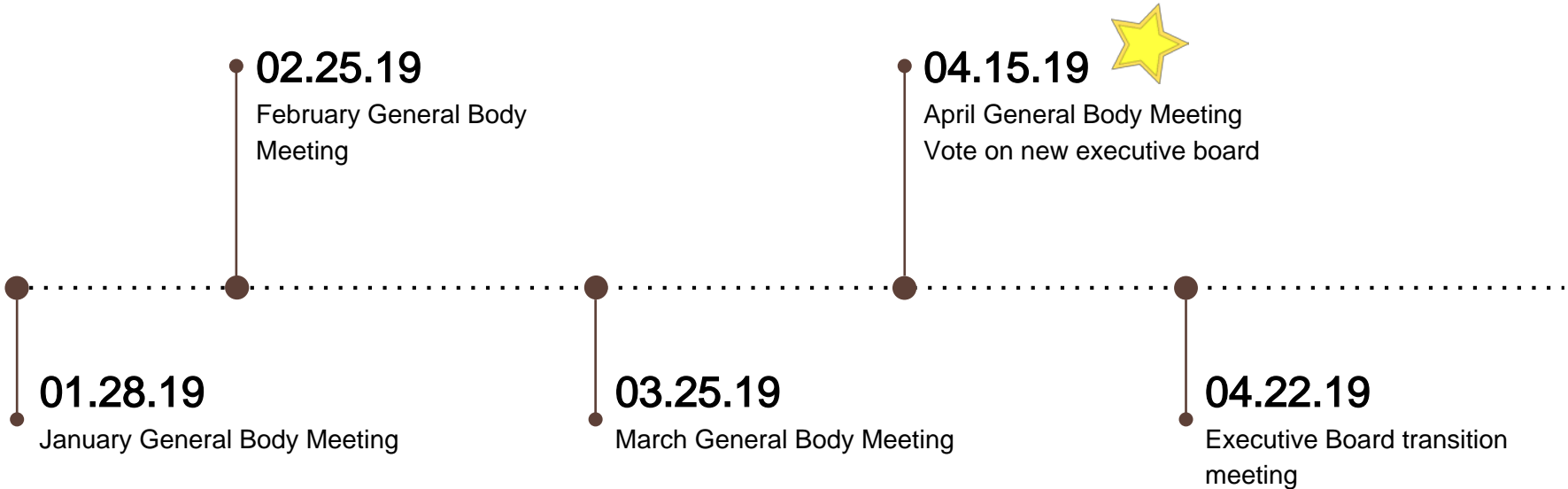

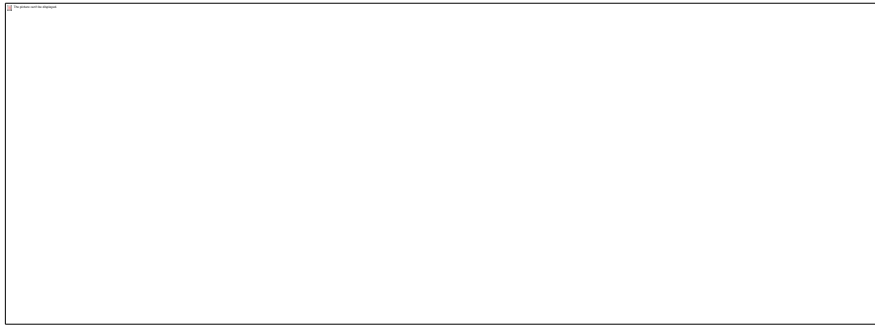

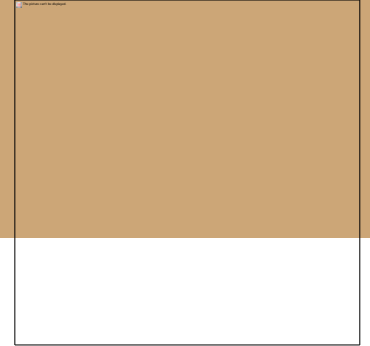

The East Carolina University Student Conduct Board is comprised of 25 students in addition to faculty and staff, who have been trained to review violations of the ECU Student Code of Conduct through a fair hearing process and provide educational sanctions. Members of the Student Conduct Board also serve on Academic Integrity Board which handles cases involving possible violations of the Academic Integrity Policy. In addition to roles stated above, student panel members will educate the University population about the rules, policies, and regulations contained in the Code through campus programming initiatives.

Application Requirement:

- Full-time ECU student (undergraduate or graduate)
- Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA
- Satisfactory academic and conduct history

Membership Expectations:

- Uphold the highest standards for their own behavior, both on and off campus and avoid involvement in situations that may lessen the perceived credibility of the conduct system;
- Place membership on the Board as a top priority behind academics;
- Maintain student confidentiality at all times;
- Attend all Fall and Spring mandatory training sessions;
- Serve on a minimum of one hearing panel per semester;
- Attend monthly meetings (dates TBD);
- Become knowledgeable about all aspects of the Student Code of Conduct;
- Participate in regular programming committee meetings and assist with important Board functions.

Graduate Students:

- Graduate students can participate as members of the Board
- Graduate Students should apply using the general application process.
- Consideration is provided to graduate students to accommodate time constraints and professional expectations.
