North Carolina: The New Frontier For Health Care Transformation

- NC ranks 33rd in overall health, almost 15% of people live below poverty line, and 1 million+ are uninsured
- Set of reforms that would create an unprecedented and accelerated shift in how state pays for healthcare and the way that social factors are incorporated into healthcare payment and delivery
- Over next 5 years, NC will make about 70% or more of healthcare payments through alternative models
 - Award contracts to 5 organizations to run Prepaid Health Plans
 - o Managed Care Organizations, Accountable Care Organizations
 - O Dashboard of indicators related to social factors influencing health
